## MICRONESIAN, MARSHALLESE, AND PALAUAN FAMILIES AND THE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT Facts Oregon Health Plan


- Micronesian, Marshallese, and Palauan individuals under 19 are eligible for Oregon Health Plan full level benefits.
- Micronesian, Marshallese, and Palauan individuals 19 and over are eligible for Oregon Health Plan CAWEM or CAWEM Plus level benefits

### Health Insurance Marketplace

- Micronesian, Marshallese, and Palauan individuals **are eligible** for “advanced premium tax credits” through the health insurance marketplace, [www.healthcare.gov](http://www.healthcare.gov).
- Advanced premium tax credits help pay for monthly insurance premiums. They are available to families earning between 0 percent and 400 percent of the federal poverty level on a sliding scale and can be used to purchase coverage **at all ages, from birth to death**. Individuals must file taxes in coming years to get the tax credits.
- Micronesian, Marshallese, and Palauan individuals **are also eligible** for “cost-sharing reductions,” which help pay for out-of-pocket costs, such as doctor visit co-pays. This financial help is based on household income and is only available for silver-level plans.

### COFA PREMIUM ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Compact of Free Association (COFA) Premium Assistance Program is Oregon’s health insurance sponsorship program for eligible citizens of the Republic of Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, and the Republic of Palau who entered the United States under the COFA. The program’s goal is to make coverage affordable for low-income COFA citizens paying for the enrollee’s share of premiums and in-network out-of-pocket expenses.



### Where can I apply for the COFA Premium Assistance Program?

You can apply at the enrollment on Saturday, October 29<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 AM-4:00 PM, at Project Access NOW, 714 SW 20<sup>th</sup> Place, Portland, OR 97205.
