



The COFA Premium Assistance Program is ending. Apply for Medicaid benefits now!

Medicaid is now available to COFA citizens. The COFA Premium Assistance Program will be ending soon. When this happens, the program will no longer pay your health insurance premiums.

Apply now for Oregon's Medicaid programs: the Oregon Health Plan (OHP); Medicare Savings Program; long-term care services; and a program for the aged, blind, and disabled.

How do I enroll?

You can apply any of the following ways:

- Online: [ONE.Oregon.gov](https://one.oregon.gov)
- By phone: 800-699-9075 (toll-free); (wait times may be long)
- In person (call ahead to make an appointment)
 - With a trained community partner. Find one at OregonHealthCare.gov/gethelp
 - At an Aging and People with Disability or Area Agency on Aging office go.usa.gov/xseNk or Self-Sufficiency office go.usa.gov/xseN9.

After you apply and are eligible for OHP, you will get a letter that confirms your benefits in two to three weeks. The COFA Premium Assistance Program will disenroll you from the program and stop paying premiums for your private plan. You must cancel your current health plan. You cannot have full OHP and receive premium tax credits at the same time. Your plan will not be automatically canceled. Call HealthCare.gov at 800-318-2596 (toll-free) to cancel your plan. You will be billed for the full cost of your monthly premium and may need to repay tax credits until your plan is canceled.

When approved for OHP, you will not pay for health coverage and there are no out-of-pocket costs to see your doctor or to get your prescription medications. Dental services are included. Check to see if your doctor accepts OHP because it replaces your current health plan. If you need help finding a new provider, call OHP client services at 800-273-0557 (toll-free).

If you have unpaid medical bills, OHP Medicaid may be able to help with those. After you receive your letter confirming your benefits, call OHP client services 800-273-0557 (toll-free) to ask.

65 or older or have a long-term disability

For those 65 and older or who have a long-term disability, apply now to find out what programs are available to you.

If you have Medicare, you may qualify for Medicare Savings Program that could help pay Medicare Part A and Part B premiums, co-pays, and deductibles.

Long-term care (LTC) services pay for long-term care costs for eligible people who meet income and other guidelines. LTC provides different services that help people who can no longer meet their own daily needs. People can receive LTC services in their own home or in-care facilities.
