



Health coverage for immigrants

Most people in the following groups are eligible for coverage through the Marketplace:

- U.S. citizens
- U.S. nationals
- Lawfully present immigrants:
 - “Qualified noncitizen” immigration status without a waiting period (see details below)
 - Humanitarian statuses or circumstances (including Temporary Protected Status, Special Juvenile Status, asylum applicants, Convention Against Torture, victims of trafficking)
 - Valid nonimmigrant visas
 - Legal status conferred by other laws (temporary resident status, LIFE Act, Family Unity individuals)

People with the following statuses do not qualify to shop through the Marketplace:

- Undocumented immigrants
- Deferred Action Child for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)

Immigration document	What to provide on application
Permanent Resident Card, or Green Card (I-551)	Provide alien number and card number (or other as doc type if no card number)
Foreign Passport	Provide passport number, expiration date, country of issuance
Employment Authorization Card (I-766)	Provide alien number, card number, expiration date, and category code
Re-entry Permit (I-327)	Provide alien number
Refugee Travel Document (I-571)	Provide alien number
Machine Readable Immigrant Visa (with temporary I-551 language)	Provide alien number, passport number, and country of issuance
Arrival/Departure Record (I-94/I-94A)	Provide I-94 number
Arrival/Departure Record in Foreign Passport (I-94)	Provide I-94 number, passport number, expiration date, and country of issuance
Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status (I-20)	Provide Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) ID
Certificate of Eligibility for Exchange Visitor Status (DS2019)	Provide Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) ID
Notice of Action (I-797)	Provide alien number or I-94
